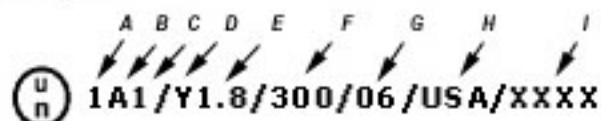




## How to Read UN Markings:

Sample:



(For embossed metal drums, the letters "UN" may be applied in place of the United Nations symbol. Letter height must be a maximum of 12mm for containers over 30 liters, or 6mm for containers under 30 liters.)

E)		Packaging Group I: Great Danger (high hazard level) Packaging Group II: Medium Danger (medium hazard level) Packaging Group III: Minor Danger (low hazard level)	
E)	1.8	Density or specific gravity of material packed OR For packaging intended for Solids or that have inner packaging, this marking will indicate the maximum gross mass (weight) in kilograms.	
F)	300	Hydraulic pressure in kilo-pascal (kPa) OR For packaging intended for Solids or that have inner packaging, an "S" in upper case will follow the gross mass.	
G)	06	Year of manufacture	
H)	USA	Country of origin
